Historical Thinking: Can you learn to think like historians?


歴史的思考:歴史家のような思考を身につけられるか

This discussion will demonstrate how historical education can be used to make lessons more accessible and interesting for students. A key concept in this discussion is 'Historical Thinking,' a term encompassing various methods of analyzing and interpreting historical evidence. Several activities will illustrate how evaluating the past can intersect with English education. But you don't have to be a teacher or a history buff to participate in this event. Anyone who is interested in thinking, reading, and learning is welcome to attend.

Eric is the author of Journey to America Today, a textbook for English learners which focuses on teaching language through the unfolding narrative of U.S. history and culture through time. The themes of the book are continuity, change, and conflict from prehistoric eras until the start of the 21st century. Any interested readers will have a chance to see copies of the textbook as part of the event.


